VOTER REGISTRATION

To qualify to register to vote, one must:

- Be a citizen of the United States
- Be 18 years old or older by the date of the next election
- Have resided in the State of New Jersey and the County of Gloucester for 30 days by the day of the next election.

HOW AND WHERE TO REGISTER

A prospective voter may register in person at either the office of the County Board of Elections, 550 Grove Road, Thorofare (West Deptford), at the Gloucester County Store in the Deptford Mall or at the office of the Borough Clerk in Glassboro.

A mail-in registration form is available from the County Superintendent of Elections (856) 384-4500, the Borough Clerk (856) 881-9230 X 88905 or the League of Women Voters/ACLU-NJ (800) 792-VOTE.

WHEN TO REGISTER

A person must register at least 21 days preceding an election. Registration is permanent in New Jersey, but one must re-register for the following reasons:

- Change in name due to marriage, divorce or by judgment of a court
- Change in residence

The exception to the re-registration rule is a move within the county.

- If the voter has moved within the county and has not notified the Commission of Registration, they may go to their new polling site and vote by Provisional Ballot.
- When a voter changes his/her name, they may vote by signing both names at the time of voting.

ELECTION DATES AND TIMES

2024 Primary Election Tuesday, June 4, 2024 6:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

2024 General Election Tuesday, November 5, 2024 6:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. Application for a Vote By Mail Ballot may be obtained in person or by mail from either the Municipal Clerk or the County Clerk. Application for a Vote By Mail Ballot must be received by the County Clerk no later than 7 days preceding the election. Vote By Mail Ballots must reach the County Board of Elections, 550 Grove Road, Thorofare, NJ 08086 by 8:00 P.M. on Election Day.

EMERGENCY PROVISIONS FOR A VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT

Within the 7-day period preceding an election and until 3:00 P.M. the day before the election, you may complete a Vote By Mail Application, in person at the office of the County Clerk. If you are ill or incapacitated, you may send someone as your messenger with written authorization to obtain your ballot and return it to the County Clerk's office.

TO RUN FOR OFFICE

Petitions to run for a political party's nomination in the Primary Election for a local office must be filed no later than 57 days before the Primary Election by 4:00 P.M. in the office of the Borough Clerk. A petition to run as an Unaffiliated candidate must be filed by 4:00 P.M. on Primary Election Day at the office of the County Clerk. For more information on running for office, contact the Municipal Clerk at (856) 881-9230 X 88144. For more information on running for the school board, contact the Board of Education at (856) 652-2700.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I need identification when I go to vote?

You will be asked to state your name and address and to sign both the Voter Registration Book and the Authority Slip. You may bring along your voter registration card and/or your sample ballot. If you are a first time voter and registered by mail but did not provide your Drivers License Number or the last four digits of your Social Security Number, you will be asked to provide information.

Must I read and write English in order to register to vote?

No. You may register and even vote, whether or not you can read or write. In non English speaking districts, provisions are made for ballots to be printed in Spanish.

How do I obtain a Vote By Mail Ballot?

The Election Official in your state can provide you with a Vote By Mail Ballot, allowing you to participate in the election by mail in the event you are unable to go to the designated voting site on Election Day. If you will need a Vote By Mail Ballot, contact your Municipal Clerk or County Clerk for a Vote By Mail Application.

Do I have to choose a political party in order to register and to vote?

Not in a General or School Board election. However, to vote in the Primary Election you must declare a particular party.

How do I join a political party?

By voting in a Primary Election, or by filling out the Party Affiliation portion of the Voter Registration Form; which can be obtained at the office of the Municipal Clerk. It will then be mailed to the Superintendent of Elections.

If I declare a preference when I register, can I change later?

Yes, simply fill out the appropriate portions of a Voter Registration Form, and mail it to the County Board of Elections 50 days prior to the Primary Election.

What is a sample ballot?

In New Jersey, before the election, each registered voter receives a Sample Ballot which is a replica of the ballot the voter will see at the polls. It also gives the time and date of the election and the location of your polling place.

What if I move right before the election?

You may go to your new polling site and vote by Provisional Ballot.

When do I have to re-register?

If you move or change your name you must re-register to vote.

When are the polls open?

For General and Primary Elections, the polls are open from 6:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

What if I need help in casting my ballot?

If you are blind, disabled or unable to read or write and need assistance in the polling booth, two Poll Workers, one from each party, will enter the booth with you and give you assistance.

Can someone help me when I go to vote if I am blind, disabled or unable to read or write?

Yes, you can bring a parent, a relative, a friend, or anybody else. This person can help you read the ballot or use the voting booth to vote. The name and address of the person giving assistance shall be recorded in front of the Voter Registration Book.
