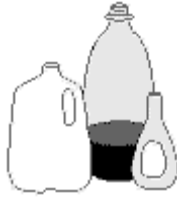

E-Waste: What Residents Can and Can't Do With Electronics

Beginning January 1, 2011 all municipalities in NJ were required to remove Electronic waste (E-Waste) from the waste stream. It is now illegal for E-waste such as TV's, computers, printers, and small appliances to be placed in your green or blue cart.

All CRT TV's, cathode ray tube televisions, monitors, and printers must be recycled. Residents can place them out for collection on their normal trash day.

Residents are not permitted to dismantle any E-waste or electronics. Any E-waste that has been dismantled or tampered with in any way will not be collected and will be considered Hazardous waste.
